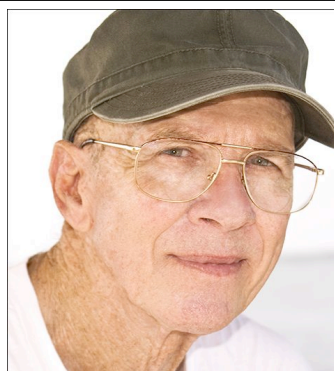

ANNOUNCEMENTS

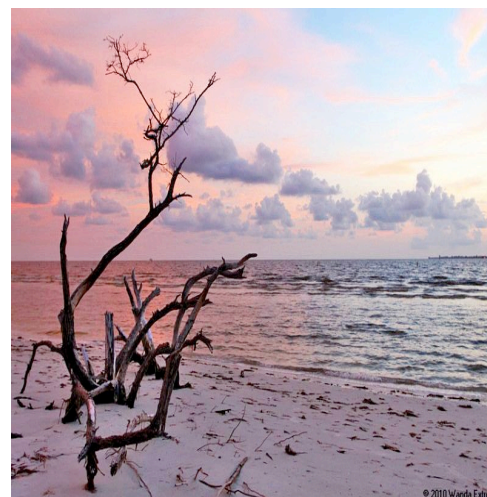
FCCC is having a convention on November 6th and 7th in Naples. The theme of the convention is nature. World-renowned photographer and environmentalist, Clyde Butcher, will give the keynote address. He will also lead a Saturday workshop into the Everglades.

Other Saturday workshops include: Corkscrew Sanctuary, Naples Botanical Gardens, Shy Wolf Sanctuary, Lighting and Modeling, and Photoshop Basics.

Nine seminars will be featured on Sunday: Birds As Art; Let There Be Light; Adobe Photoshop; Framing & Matting; HDR Ins & Outs; Secrets To Creating High Quality Coffee Table Books; Create Exciting Slideshows; Outdoor Portraiture; and Adobe Lightroom.

A keynote address, a panel discussion on “Photo Manipulation, Is It Photography Or Graphic Art?,” photo-ops and an old-fashioned pig roast and luau will fill the Sunday activities.
